



CITIZEN'S SUMMARY Annual Implementation Report 2022



A citizen's summary of the contents of the Annual Report has been made public and uploaded as an annex to the Annual Implementation Report. The Annual Report 2022 of the Interreg V-A Slovakia-Austria Cooperation Programme has been prepared pursuant to Annex X of Commission Implementing Regulation (EU) 2015/207. The report is intended to give an overview of the activities that were undertaken in the frame of the programming process, focusing on the year 2022. Regarding its structure, the Interreg V-A SK-AT Cooperation Programme addresses five investment priorities (IP) under four priority axes (PA). In addition, a fifth priority axis, Technical Assistance, has been introduced.

This summary reports on Interreg V-A SK-AT activities in 2022. It presents key points and highlights from the year.





response to current developments in the field of public transport, while at the same time creating a sustainable and environmentally friendly link between the two countries.






Slovakia – Austria

The 1st meeting of the Monitoring committee for the Interreg Programme Slovakia-Austria 2021-2027 was held on 7 December 2022 in Marchegg.



During 2022, the **Programme bodies** also had 14 Task Force (TF) meetings, out of which 9 were held in the "Programming group" format (TF members + external experts), as well as numerous technical meetings with the relevant stakeholders (including representatives of MA, **RB**[´]s, JS, national, regional authorities, EC and relevant Ministries) related to preparation of the 2021-2027 Programme.

COMMUNICATION

The MA/JS continuously informed the target groups about the stages of the implementation, provided useful information, downloadable documents and project news via the website programme (www.sk-at.eu) and through (www.facebook.com/interregskat.eu). Facebook addition, the database In Keep (www.keep.eu) with project information has been regularly updated. All communication activities were affected by the restrictions of Covid- 19 pandemic situation, therefore the MA/JS prepared online seminars and cosultations via Webex, MS Teams, Zoom, etc. 16 newsletters were sent out to the subscribed readers in 2022.



As for the Annual Event, the Programme took the opportunity to be part of the Lower Austrian Regional held from Exhibition, which was 13.11.2022 26.03.2022 to in the premises of the Marchegg Castle, and to present its results. Posters and videos dedicated to the Programme and the 12 successful projects could be viewed free of charge by visitors at the entrance to the exhibition.
